



Water Poster Competition 2020

The Detail

South Gippsland Water Poster Competition compliments National Water Week activities. Primary School students are asked to create a poster reflecting water related issues which are important and relevant to them and their local area.

Poster entries are invited in four categories:

1. Prep / Foundation
2. Years 1 & 2
3. Years 3 & 4
4. Years 5 & 6

Great prizes can be won by the student and the school at both local AND state level judging.

Teachers – this is a great activity for the classroom. Last year thousands of poster entries were received from Victorian Primary Schools.

State level is judged in October, prizes are available to the school that the first-place and second-place posters from each of the categories.

Kids - entries will be judged locally at the time of submission with winners in each category submitted for state judging in October.

At state level prizes are available to the students that produce the first-place and second-place posters in each of the categories.

Winners will be chosen using the following criteria:

- How well the poster conveys water related issues relevant to your area ie; inland school posters would not be focussed on ocean activities
- How well it can be reproduced to promote National Water Week
- Appearance: attractively displayed in colour
- How good it looks from a distance
- Effective use of art materials
- Originality of design or innovative concept
- One entry per student
- One student per poster

Entry criteria

- Poster MUST be A3 (30x40cm) in size
- Any medium, including paper, can be used
- Any art material can be used including paint, textas, coloured pencils or collage materials
- An official entry form must be securely attached to the back of each poster
